

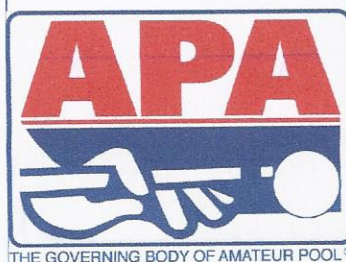
## Chinook Winds (Continued)

The **3-Person team event** which included both the round robin phase and the 64 board Modified Single Elimination phase had a total payout of **\$17,250.** which was paid out to the top 64 finishers in the 148 Team field.

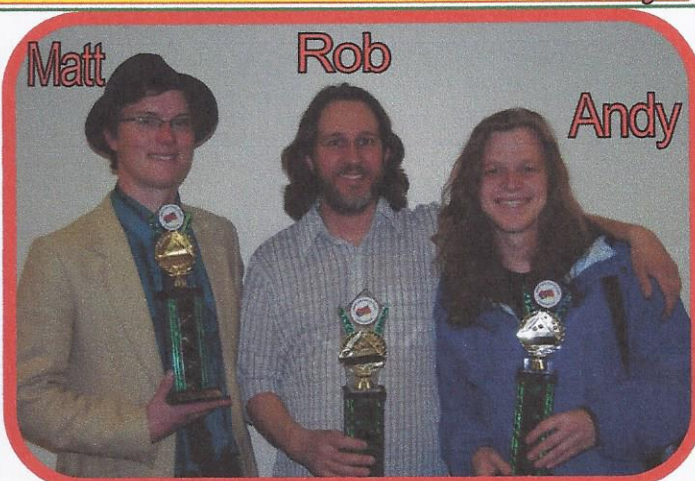

Saturday Morning at 11 AM Registration began for the \$25 entry, double elimination Lincoln City Open tournament—directed by Billiards and Barstool's *Steve Lingelbach* and *Carissa Biggs*. Actual play began at approximately 12:30 PM There was a record 82 signups for the double elimination 8-Ball event which was a race to "5" on the winner's side and a race to "4" on the one loss side. It was a long and exhausting day with the competition being suspended just after midnight, and then resuming again on Sunday morning and then finishing up around 2 in the afternoon. Play, was at a skilled premium, as a majority of the matches came right down to the wire at double hill. The top eight finishers are listed in the table at right: :

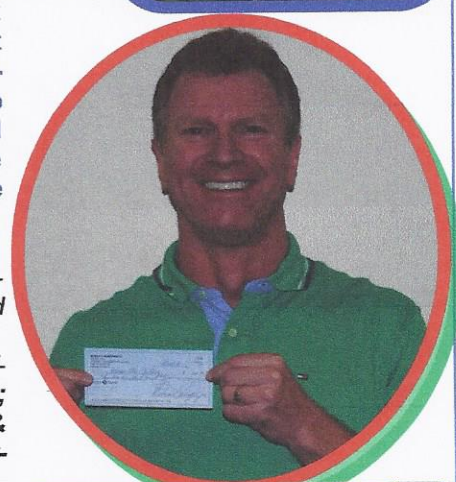

## Capt.-Co-Captain Tournament



The first Saturday beginning the new session is the OPAL day of appreciation for all those who commanded teams the previous session. Rodders in Oregon City hosted the 22 player turnout. With the \$15 per player entry, and \$45 in added money from Rodders and OPAL we had a total payout purse of \$365 which was paid to the top '8' finishers in the field.

The 32 Board tournament chart was modified single elimination which meant that every player was guaranteed to play at least two times, but beginning the 3rd round in the winners side it then became single elimination. The format was patterned similar to that of the US Amateur in that both 8-Ball and 9-Ball games were usually played. The winner of the lag had first choice of either to break or to name the game. If the lag winner chose to break then the opponent chose what game to play first. If the lag winner chose to name the game then the opponent got to break. Skill level 2 & 3's had to win 2 games; Skill Level 4 & 5's had to win 3 games; and Skill level 6 & 7's had to win a total of four games.

We got started around 12:30 Pm just after everyone was registered, the board drawn, and a brief player's meeting. We used all of the tables that were made available and the event progressed quickly. The final match ended a little bit after 6:00 PM. Everyone had a great time. **Special kudo's** to the Rodder's Staff & Crew who did a wonderful job as hosts for this event. Also, to **Don "Coyote" Walker** for officiating and helping **Merle** with setting up the tournament.

The race to the "bragging rights" was a straight forward journey for both finalists. **Jonathan** (SL-7) **Hahn**, Co-Captain of "The Blackbirds" who plays out of Back Alley in the Northern Double Jeopardy division, went undefeated all the way to the finals. Grabbing one of the first round "Byes" he began with a 2nd round 4-1 win over **Don** (SL-5) **Jones** and then pulled out a 4-2 victory over **Paul** (SL-7) **Johnson** which put Paul in the bridesmaid slot and ended his tournament journey for the day. In the next Round, after fighting her way valiantly back through the loser's side, **Bridgette** (SL-4) **Len-wai** got clobbered 4-zip, but got to take home \$25 5th place money. In the Semi Final match **Rick** (SL-5) **Hoyle** reached the hill first with 3 racks left to go, but **Jonathan** took the next two games to make it double hill, then won the case game to go on to the finals. **Rick** got \$50 for 3rd place.

Meanwhile, not drawing a first round "Bye" **Paul** (SL-7) **Marquez** who Captain's "Masters RRH" in the Masters division came out of the gate and Zipped **Shannon** (SL-3) **Young** sending her off to go play in the one loss side. In round two action **Paul** lost the first game of the match to **Heidi** (SL-4) **Piehl**, but then rallied and took the next four games straight to win the match and send Heidi to the backyard. In round 3 **Paul** wiped out **Tim** (SL-6) **Higginson** 4-Zip and qualify for the money. His next match was no cake walk. He came up against **Don** (SL-7) **Walker** who brought him to double/double hill. It was close but **Paul** won the case game to secure the match and leaving **Don** behind with \$25 in his pocket.

Next **Paul** took on **Kim** (SL-5) **Trip** and defeated her 4-1 to move on into the finals match up against **Jonathan** (SL-7) **Hahn**.

In The race to 4 Finals, **Paul** won the lag, and took the break. **Jonathan** named 8-Ball. **Paul** Took Game 1, **Jonathan** took games 2. & 3 then they switched to 9-Ball. He won the next three games in a row to claim the match and victory 4-2, the top money-\$100, and all the bragging rights to being the champion of the 2013 Spring Session Capt & Co-Capt Tournament. For 2nd place **Jonathan** received \$75.
