OPAL- APA NW 9-BALL CHALLENGE At Chinook Winds Casino in Lincoln City was Awesome!

the WPBA (Women's Professional Billiards Association) first hand—up close and personal— just like they've always seen on TV. All week long the Pro's intermingled among the amateurs and spectators telling stories and giving autographs, doing challenges, and playing in the mini's when ever an opportunity came about.

Starting out with a Pro-Am on Wednesday November 8th:

Pening Ceremony

At 7:30 PM on Thursday evening Nov, 9th we began opening ceremony / players meeting-a-la-Boomer & John Blue. It also included informative later presentations from Steve Tipton—WPBA Tournament Director—giving the welcoming invocation,

Steve's a very energetic speaker who informed everyone of what was going to be happening in the pro tournament room and **Jeanette Lee** who is the official WPBA player representative for APA, welcomed everyone to the event.

After the conclusion of the opening Ceremony the 3-person team competition began it's first round-robin-flight with a total combined field of 105 teams entered. The field was broken down into 2 flights of 52 and 53 teams and on into 3 and 4 team brackets. One flight would play while the other flight was free to do what they wanted—gamble, watch the pros, enter mini's, beat the Merle, or just relax and get something to eat.

By Friday night at 7:30 PM the Round Robin Portion of the 3-person tournament had been completed. And by 8:30 PM the new modified single elimination board had been drawn, set up, and underway, as scheduled, with the winning teams in each of the 27 three & four team boards plus the wild cards drawn from 2nd place moving on to the double elimination board part of the competition.

Saturday's play found us resuming with the 3rd round of 3-person play at 9 AM followed by the start of the Weekender Scotch Doubles at 10: AM Followed by countless "Billiards & Barstools" hosted mini's and a 56 person singles tournament. By Nights end it had to be all be over.

In the 56 persons entered "Lincoln City Open"—a double elimination single's event directed by "Billiards and Barstools," paid out the \$1,450 purse to the top 16 finishers. Chad Vilmont from Illinois and Mark Haddad from Denver split 1st & 2nd place money (\$350 + \$225=\$287.50 Ea) Bobby Zack of Portland took 3rd (\$150), Steve Lingelbach of Portland took 4th & \$125. Tied 5/6 and winning \$100 Ea was Vince Mellot and Grant Walstrom. Tied 7/8th & winning \$70 Each was Darin Walding and Tavis Wagner. Tied 9/12 th and winning \$40 Each was Peni Mesa, Tim Guimares, Duane Allen, and Ira Montour, and last tied at 13/16th and winning \$25 Each was Randy Baker, Steve Copher, Shelby Locati, and Martin Wragg.

of those losses were twelve 9-Ball Breaks and three Break 'n Runs by the challengers) Unfortunately, for Merle, none of the WPBA pro's who were competing next door were able to "find" the time to come in and take over the challengers for him although for a while Jeanette Lee & Vivian Villareal did some charity Challenges on their own, but there were no pro relievers that came in to take over some of his challenges. However, early Saturday morning he did finally get a little break when Portland's finest —freshly back from Hawaii— **Bobby Zack**, came in and took over the helm for a few matches giving Merle a much welcomed break.

Several people succeeded in beating Merle and got a ticket in a drawing for 3 prizes—A nice McDermott Cue with multiple inlays, A nice Cue Tec Breaking cue, and a great Lacassi "Jump" cue. The Challenger always got to break and those that snapped the "9" in on the break were given two bonus tickets in the drawing, and those who broke and ran got one bonus ticket in the drawing. Those who just beat Merle only got one ticket in the drawing—which was held just shortly after Midnight on Saturday night.
