Started off at 9 am on Thursday morning with the Early Bird Scotch. There were 53 teams in the event and when the dust settled the team of "Beauty and The Beast" with Mark Griffin and Ashley Smith took the top honors. At 2 pm, we started the Singles event. 99 players were broken down into the following skill level groups to compete for cash prizes and a chance to earn a spot at the 2014 Spring Singles Regionals. Skill levels 3 and below, Skill level 4, Skill level 5, Skill level 6 and Skill levels 7-9. This event was so popular, that we will be adding it to our program for the 2014 APA 8 Ball NW Invitational in April. In the skill level 4 bracket, Randy Messner took 1st, winning \$125 and a spot to singles regionals. Wendy Curtis



took 2nd and won \$95, followed by Andy Tran and Kevin Miller, tied for 3/4 and winning \$60 each.



In the skill level 5 bracket, Jeff Perkins took 1st place and \$130. The singles qualifying portion of the tournament was won by Angela Franklin, who finished 2nd in the money portion and took home \$100. Followed by tied for 3/4 Colby Garvin and Michael Choe \$75 each and tied for 5/8 Maxine Buhler, Darrel Vanzant, Larry Abel erkins and Ryan Kauzlarich \$50 each.

In the skill level 6 bracket, David Knight took 1st, won \$125 and won the spot to singles regionals. Other top finishers were 2nd Larry Gee \$95 and tied 3/4 Rebecca Slyter and Richard Ohnstad receiving \$70 each.





In the 7-9 bracket, David Scarth won the qualify-

ing round and took the slot to Singles regionals. In the money portion of the tournament, it was down to Pru Peltier and Jonathan Hahn. Both were pooped and they decided to just split the pot. Each received \$110 and Pru took home the trophy. Tied for 3/4 were Tyrel Datwyler and David Scarth, both received \$70.

At 6 pm, we started the Pool Gods Tournament. We had 48 players sign up which were blind drawn into 24 scotch doubles teams. It was a double elimination, race to 2, fast 8 competition and played like normal scotch doubles where players alternate shots. The catch was that the Head Pool God, John Blue, would randomly stop play on all tables, roll the dice and the number that came up would determine the fate of all



teams playing at that time. Some of the fates were "Current shooter must take the next shot using the butt end of their cue" or "Pool Gods will pick up the cue ball and place it anywhere on the table" or "Pool Gods will pick the pocket that the 8 ball must go in to claim the game" Tony Graham and

Don Walker graciously volunteered to be the Pool Gods. It was pure craziness, but a lot of fun. In the end, the team of Kevin McCarthy and Bill Walker took the top honors. All of this was just the first day of the event.



At 9 am on Friday, the 3 person team event commenced. 100 teams were drawn into 25 round robin flights. They would play each team in their bracket trying to earn as many team points as possible. At the end of 3 rounds, the field was dropped down to 48 teams to go into the next phase. The 1st place team in each flight automatically advanced to the 48 board, then the rest of the board was filled by blind draw of all of the 2nd place teams in each flight until all slots were filled. On Saturday, the remaining 48 teams, played in the modified singles bracket where play came down to when it was mathematically impossible for one team to win.
