REMEMBER, You have only until the writing of the <u>2nd Newsletter following the one your number is in to</u> <u>call the league office with the magic words "Gimme My Shirt</u>" Otherwise, it's off you go to the loser's corner where everyone can see you and laugh, giggle, snort, and snicker because they know there'll be a shirt waiting for them seeing how you must not of wanted yours! <u>BE AN OPAL WINNER -- FIND YOUR NUMBER</u>

It has come to my attention that there are some individuals marking down all kick shots as being defensive shots, while there are others who maintain that a kick shot should never be marked as a defensive shot. So what's the correct answer??? Well certainly it's not one of the two stated above. Way back in elementary school we were supposed to have learned that it's quite unlikely that most things are either "All" or "Never"—At least we should be suspicious or skeptical. It all boils down to *INTENT!* Specifically...the *INTENT* of the shooter. You must ask yourself: Did the shooter fire at the ball with enough velocity in hopes of making a good hit and possibly legally pocketing a ball somewhere—somehow? Or, did the shooter just shoot hard enough hoping that he, she, or it, would get lucky enough to possibly make a legal hit on the ball and escape having to give up Ball in Hand to the opponent?

Shooting just hard enough with the simple intent to make a good hit **IS AND WILL ALWAYS BE** a defensive shot, and still should be marked as such. (even if a foul occurs giving up the shooter's turn in the process.) Shooting with significant velocity to possibly hit the ball and hoping to make that ball or another ball fall in the pocket somewhere normally wouldn't be a defensive shot.—unless, possibly, you happen to be a Pro Pool Player in which case YOU won't be playing in an APA league anyway!

<u>It doesn't matter how difficult, or how much of a magician one had to be to even make the good hit</u>. What does matter however, is the amount of force and velocity used to execute the shot that determines the shooter's *intent*. A shooter *"hoping to pocket a ball"* is the same as *"Intent to Pocket A Ball."* Wanting, or meaning, to shoot hard enough is not the same as actually shooting hard enough. Either the shooter <u>DID</u> shoot hard enough, or the shooter <u>DIDN'T</u>. The physical facts therefore, are the indicator. The physical facts are what your judgment should be based upon.

The bottom line to this dilemma is the same for all shots. It basically all comes down to the reality of whether or not, the shooter actually proved his intent to pocket a ball by the way that shooter executed the shot. Keep in mind however, that APA players with integrity, generally will announce their intent —*if they're going to make a defensive shot*—prior to even shooting. Otherwise, the facts preside and the scorekeeper decides.
