August 14 — 24th The Riviera Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas was stuffed with pool players. Not just any pool players mind you, but APA pool players from all over the US, Canada, and Japan-Each with aspirations and high hopes of being part of a winning team that would be taking home big chunks of National APA prize monies.

From August 16 - 20st Running parallel to each other were the 458+ APA National Team 9-Ball Championships, The Ladies APA National 8-Ball Team Championships, and the APA open 8 & 9-Ball Scotch Doubles championships. From the 20th through the 25th it was the 732 team APA National 8-Ball Team Championships competing.

Running in parallel with that was the Aug. 19-22nd 256 team Triple RE AN OPAL WINNER --- FIND YOUR NUMBER! Play Masters championship. "The Vultures" placed 65th and "The Coolers" placed 97th just one and two spots out of the money respectively.

Aug. 14-24 we had six 9-Ball teams representing our Portland/Vancouver area. "Works For Us" & "Shot Effect" finished 65th & won \$500. The other 4 teams received last place money and enjoyed a tremendous Las Vegas vacation.

We had seven 8-Ball teams competing in the Aug. 17-24th Championships. 3 teams made it to 129th Place and \$1,000. They were: "A Roast Beef Sammich," "Cheap Dates," and "8-9 Suited." The other 4 teams however received their last place money of \$350 had a great time enjoying their hard fought for Las Vegas vacation.

In the Aug. 17-19th Jack 'n Jill Scotch doubles category, "Yogi & Boo Boo" (Jim & Karen Upshaw) finished out of the money in 193rd place. However "About Time" with Stacy "kiss kiss" Enriquez & Joe "Dabba Dabba Doo" Dubanski went all the way to 17th place and won \$300.


In the \$5 entry Survivor games, there were always 12 contestants in each game pay-



## Capt.-Co-Captain

The first Saturday beginning the new session is the OPAL day of appreciation for all those who commanded teams the previous session. Rodders in Oregon City hosted the 23 player turnout. With the \$15 per player entry, and \$65 in added money from Rodder's and OPAL we had a total payout purse of \$410 which was paid to the top '12' finishers in the field.

The 32 Board tournament chart was modified single elimination which meant that every player was guaranteed to play at least two times, but beginning the 3rd round in the winners side it then became single elimination. The format was patterned similar to that of the US Amateur in that

both 8-Ball and 9-Ball games were usually played. The winner of the lag had first choice of either to break or to name the game. If the lag winner chose to break then the opponent chose what game to play first. If the lag winner chose to name the game then the opponent got to break. Skill level 2 & 3's had to win 2 games; Skill Level 4 & 5's had to win 3 games; and Skill level 6 & 7's had to win a total of four games.

We got started around 12:15 Pm just after everyone was registered, the board drawn, and a brief player's meeting. We used all of the diamond tables in the front section and the event progressed quickly. The final match ended at 6:00 PM. Everyone had a great time. **Special kudo's** to the Rodder's Staff & Crew who did a wonderful job as hosts for this event. ed Dallas (SL-5) Roemeling in a double / double hill thriller 4-2 to move into the finals. Dallas got



graciously co-hosted our OPAL-APA Fall Session 9-Ball Tri-Cup. Rodder's hosted the Sunday finals. The Hosts and crews of both places did a nice job as hosts. Other then some microphone connection problems at Rodder's everything seemed to go along pretty smooth logistically.

There were 39 9-Ball division finalist teams competing in the Modified Single elimination format,— which was double elimination through the first 2 rounds transcending into single elimination beginning the third round. It was a weekend of close competition with many of the team matches going right down to the last rack to decide a winner. However, if a team reached 50 points with three match wins, or got to 51 points then the match was declared over.

We had a total payout fund of \$13,236 which was dispersed throughout the entire field. 75% of the total matches came down to double hill and almost half of those came down to the last rack. We ran one round on Friday night, three rounds on Saturday, and concluded on Sunday with four rounds finishing up at 7:30 PM. An interesting statistic this time around was that only 2 of the 6 teams that lost on Friday lost their very next match to be put out of the tournament. Apparently Summer Re-Runs wasn't part of the curriculum! The final results were as follows:
