There were 53 division 8-Ball finalists teams competing in the Modified Single elimination format,— which is double elimination through the first 2 rounds on the winner's side transcending into single elimination beginning the third round. On the back side there the back page this week for were two 9:00 Am at the Midway, and three 9:00 matches up at Rodders. Unfortunately, one of the teams playing at the Midway read the board wrong and assumed since they lost on Friday night they'd not be playing again until Saturday at 1:00 PM. Sadly, they made a crucial error—they were not supposed to be at the Midway at 1:00 PM, but at 9:00 Am. When Boomer finally got hold of the missing team Captain about 9:30 AM she was told it would be another 45 minutes before they could get there, so she felt due to the excessive time restraints, she had no other choice but to forfeit them. This gave them their 2nd loss which put that team out of the tournament. Other then that travesty, it was a weekend of close competition with many of the team matches going right down to the last rack to decide a winner. However, when it reached the point where it had became mathematically impossible for either of the two teams to win, then, the match was declared over.

We ran one round on Friday night, three rounds on Saturday, and concluded on Sunday with four rounds finishing up-including pictures and medallions at Rodders by 8:30 PM.

Hood D.J. division was River Road House's "Milwaukie's Best" with Team Captain Evan Smelser, and teammates: Chris & Sarah Nieland, Kelsey Bayloess, Casey Fliegel, Dede Dickow, Annie Tope, and Michael Veary.

The fact that both eventual finalists started out at the Midway on Friday night was the only comparative journey similarity between the two of them. The "Timber Cutters" started in slot # 11 and immediately got chopped up into back side sized kindling by "Sotally Tober." The "Cutters" got a "BYE" in the 9 AM Round, and got to sleep in. The "Cutters" ate up "Sloppy Joes" in that round, and then killed the "Chalking Dead" in the 5 PM round to get moved back across to the winner's side landing in the upper tier of the "Rodder's" bracket to compete in the Bridesmaid/medal round Sunday morning against undefeated "Chalk & Awe." Playing now on two tables In the 1:00 Bronze/Silver Medal round the "<u>Cutters</u>" effectively out shot "<u>Shot Effect</u>" to lay claim to at least the Silver while "<u>The Effects</u>" went out the door to home with a check for "\$650." In the Semi's "<u>The Cutters</u>" spanked the "<u>Little Monsters</u>" to gain admission into the finals, and left the rug rats behind holding silver and a \$900. check.

"Milwaukie's Best's" journey took them down a straight path all the way—undefeated— to the finals. "The Best's" started out in slot #23 at the Midway on Friday night by kicking the "Pool Dawgs" over to the one loss side. (The "Pool Dawgs" regrouped and chewed their way all through the one loss side, and eventually returned to claim Bronze.) In the 9 Am Saturday morning round "The Best's" fed the "Sloppy Joes" what turned out to be a one way ticket into the back side. In the 5 PM winner's side match "The Best's" sank their hooks into the "Pool Sharks" leaving them to flounder their way home with \$365 in pocket change. So, then it was off to Sunday's competition up at Rodders for the "Bests."

In Sunday's 9-Am Bridesmaid / Bronze round the ""The Best's" had refreshed. They stampeded "Horseless in OC" after a double hill thriller—right on out the door with \$475 to claim at least a Bronze Medallion necklace. Going into the 1:00 PM Bronze/Silver Medal round. The "Best's" "crossed" the door to the undefeated "Ah So Crose" leaving them behind holding the Bronze and a check for \$650. In the 3:00 PM Silver/Gold Medal round the "Best's" functioned so well they made "Disfunction R US" live up to their name. The dysfunctional team quickly left the premises with the Silver and a \$900 check. Now it was off to the Gold / Platinum finals against their last obstacle —The "Timber Cutters"

The finals, most thought, would be close. It wasn't as it turned out. The contest was begun with a clumsily rat-a-tat-tat color of money break on 5 simultaneous match tables—8,10,11,12 & 13. When the last match on the last table was over the final results were as follows:

"Cut's" SL-4 **Randal Barber** 4-Zip to score a 3-Zip win.

**Finishing 4th** on Table 12, "Best's" SL-3 *Kelsey Bayless* out played "Cut's" SL-4 Team Captain—*Owen Vandehey* winning 2-1 for a 2-1 score.

**Finishing 5th** on Table 11 "Best's" SL-5 **Sarah Nieland** battled "Cut's" SL-4 **David Johnson.** The match went to double hill before **Sarah** claimed the final victory 4-2 and recorded a 2-1 win.
