excellent, and the food and drink was both plentiful and refreshing.

There were 44 division 9-Ball finalists teams competing in the Modified Single elimination format,— which is double elimination through the first 2 rounds transcending into single elimination beginning the third round. It was a weekend of close competition with many of the team matches going right down to the last rack to decide a winner. However, if a team reached 50 points with three match wins, or 51 points the match was declared over.

We had a total payout fund of \$18,920 (Up a little over \$1500 from this time last year) which was dispersed throughout the entire field. 77% of the total matches came down to double hill and almost 60% of those came down to the last rack. We ran one round on Friday night, three rounds on Saturday, and concluded on Sunday with four rounds finishing up at 7:30 PM. An amazing statistic this time around was that half of the teams that lost on Friday lost their very next match to be put out of the tournament. Statistically translated this means the competition was both keen and evenly matched. The results are as follows:

Special Notice: Though the "KISS OF DEATH" missed out on winning a medallion, they still earned a spot in Regionals by right of succession as the team that beat them in the Sunday morning medal round-"STR8 CATS"- were already regionally qualified from the previous Summer Session. Therefore, by the right of succession, (since a team cannot win two regional spots and deprive another team from going and competing in regional play) Scotty's "Kiss Of Death" from the Skyline Double Jeopardy division—with Team Captain: Paula Meza, and teammates--, Steve Armijo, Stuart Clough, Patrick Moon, Yami Agular, Chris Beebe, Dalani Sugino and Jason Jung will get to continue on to regionals and compete for one of the coveted slots to Las Vegas Nationals.

FINISHING 1ST and winning the bragging rights—the coveted Platinum Medallions— and the top money prize of \$1,600 was: Touche's "Leftovers" from the Central 9-Ball division with Team Captain: Kenneth Romer, and teammates--Hope O'Connor, Ryan Phelps, Eric Wittinger, Susan Wright, Abigail LaMontagne, Kevin Cochran, and J.D. Stubenberg.

Pinals. Drawing a "Bye" on Friday Night at KC's Midway, they began on Saturday morning by getting ambushed by the eventual Bronze winning "The Other Guys" and sent over to the one loss side to face yet another "BYE" in the 1 PM round. By the time Saturday's 5 PM round rolled around they had refocused, "Fortune Star" took the win away from "For the Win" and sent them right out the door. Now at days end, it was off to a good night's sleep and then back to the Midway for the 9 AM Sunday morning medal round.

Sunday morning they dramatically overwhelmed "No Drama" in a double hill thriller to guarantee themselves a spot in the 2012 June Regionals. In the 1 PM round the Fortune stars out-witted and outplayed "Jakes Crusaders" leaving them behind with the Bronze while they went on to face "The Ravens" in the 3 PM team match-race for the Silver/Gold. That match was fought all the way down to double hill before the fortunate stars managed to clip the wings of the Ravens and leave them behind holding the Silver while they—the Fortune Stars—traipsed off down the last little segment of the trail to the finals.

Meanwhile Touche's "Leftovers" sorta took a very sililiar defeated parallel path to the finals. Except for the fact that they didn't have a "BYE" on Friday night, and their journey began up at Rodder's, They started out Friday night by knocking the "Happy" out of "Happy-Go-Lucky" sending them sadly to the one-loss side. Right out of the gate on Saturday morning though the "Secret Society-Falco's" ambushed them and tossed their carcasses over to the one-loss side to ponder on what had just happened! During the 1:00 Pm round they barely got past "Kiss Kiss" and go on to the 5 PM round where they would end up battling Shamrock's "Version 2" all the way into double hill sudden death and right down to the very last ball before receiving their pass to Sunday's 9 Am round.

In the Sunday 9am round the "leftovers" softened up Ringo's "Why So Hard?" to claim the bragging rights, to at least a Bronze Medallion and a slot to regionals.

In the 1 PM Sunday the "leftovers" wiped out the "Other Guys" and left them behind holding the Bronze, and in the 3 PM round "Leftovers" twisted the tails of the "Str8 Cats" sending them "meowing" out the door with the Silver, and so now it was off the finals for the "Leftovers" with only "Fortune Star" being the last team to be standing in their way.

The finals started out on 4 tables simultaneously (It would have been 5 tables but we were short one scorekeeper) with a simultaneous "Color of Money" break, and the double hill final results between Touche's "Leftovers" and the Park Rose Division "Fortune stars" were as follows:

On Table 6: Star's SL-5 *John Phanthalagsy* slaughtered Over's SL-5 *Ryan Phelps* 35-14 for an applied score of 18-2.

On Table 1: Star's SL-4 *Cole Malivanh* clobbered Over's SL-2 *Susan Wright* 31-11 for an applied score of 15-5 bringing the two table total to 33-7 in favor of the Fortune Stars.

On Table 2: Star's SL-4 *Christopher Limbrick* got his butt kicked by Over's SL-4 *Hope O'Connor* 31-14 for an applied score of 17-3. Match now 36 to 24 in favor of the Fortune Stars.

On table 4: Star's Captain — SL-3 *Jamie Bui* got eaten by Over's Captain— SL-4 *Kenneth Romer* 31-15 for an applied score of 15-5, bringing the comeback total to 41-39 still in favor of the Fortune Star.

On table 3: for the deciding factor—Star's SL-4 Edward Truong got his butt totally spanked by Over's SL-3 Abigail LaMontagne 25-11 for a 18-2 applied score for the Leftovers bringing the total match score to 57-43 in favor of Touche's "leftovers" (Continued Page 4.)
