We had exactly 57 division 8-Ball finalists teams competing in the Modified Single elimination format,— guaranteeing that all teams got to play twice, but not necessarily lose twice. It was a weekend of close competition using the new three point scoring system. Many of the team matches came right down to wire and double hill when deciding the winner. Once a team reached a point where it was mathematically impossible for the other team to win then the match was declared over.

We had a nice payout of \$23,1980 (Up \$1000 from 2 years ago) which was dispersed throughout the entire field. Both finalist teams took the longest journey possible to make it to the final pairing.

Stemming from the west side's Sunset D.J. division Scotty's "Bugger Off's" journey to the finals was totally perilous and full of drama... Plus, without a doubt, there had to be a few underwear changings along the way. On Friday night the "Buggers" got "scared off" to the one loss side by Star House's "Fear This." (totally understandable 'cause "Coyote" gets scared every time he looks in the mirror! He said affectionate lol) Fortunately for the "Buggers" they drew a "Bye" and had time to sleep in, heal their wounds, and get rested up to prepare for the next day's battling.

In the 1 PM round the "Buggers" overcame the already qualified "Cliff's Tavern" team by a narrow margin, and sent them out the door to the road to home. The "<u>Buggers</u>" broke well against Cascade's "<u>Breaking Bad</u>" in the 1:00 Bronze/Silver Medal round and eventually sent them outside for pictures on their way home with the Bronze. Next, In the 3:00 PM Silver/Gold round "<u>The Bugger's</u>" out buggered Back Alley's "<u>8-9 Suited</u>" thus respectively ending their journey and left them behind holding onto the Silver while the "<u>Bugger's</u>" moved on into the final Gold/Platinum round, where they would face "<u>The Money Shots</u>." from Pub 181.

Pub 181's "The Money Shots" had an identical, journey line to the finals as did "Bugger Off." Their Journey also started out on Friday night and exactly like the "Bugger's," found themselves getting instantly slapped into the one loss side by Wrangler's "Motley Cues." In spite of the fact that this was the first time in a Tri-Cup final, Scotty's "Bugger Off," made a respectable attempt at winning, and the match came down to the last table playing .

On the first table, Bugger's Captain SL-4 *Kevin Zandi* clobbered the Shot's SL- 4 *Alex Hoyt* 3-Zip — Score 3-Zip for the "Bugger Offs."

For their efforts Scotty's team of "Bugger Off" from the Sunset division respectfully received the Gold Medallion necklaces, appropriate bragging rights, and a check for \$1,300, plus entry into the Regionals.

The next step will be the June 13-15, 2014 8-Ball Regionals where all of the pictured teams will compete along with the honorable and worthy finalists from both the Summer and Fall 8-Ball Tri-Cup competitions. We will have seven slots allocated to us for the 2014 APA National 8-Ball Team Championship at the Riviera Hotel & Casino in Las Vegas Nevada, August 72-65th, 1279.
