Ringo's in Beaverton June 27 & 28th hosted the 8 & 9-Ball Horizon Double Jeopardy division Super-Pool Team Regional with

Boomer directing and John Blue, Shawn Kellar, Kevin McCarthy, and Stephen Schneringer officiating. The main difference between teams who play in the Super-Pool division and those who play in the Open division are that in Super-pool teams have a "26" rule instead of a "23" rule. However no more then two SL-7's can play in a match, and there is no championship slot to Las Vegas—just a bunch of bucks, a gaggle of trophies, and of course, the all important Super-Pool Community "Bragging Rights!"

Since there were only 4 teams playing in each of the two disciplines with only one team in each that was not common to both, — (**Dugout's** "<u>Yeah, Buts, & Oh No's</u>" only qualified for 8-Ball, and **Underground's** "<u>Blood, Sweat, & Fireballs</u>") only qualified in 9-Ball. The other 3 teams were "Double Qualified" and common to both 8 & 9-Ball Regional competition. To determine who would be the most comprehensive winner, the Round Robin Format was the chosen vehicle. It was put into motion using two tables for each Saturday 8-Ball and each Sunday 9-Ball team match. Sudden death, that normally goes into effect with regular open team Tri-Cups and regional events (3 hours from the start of the match for 9-Ball, and three hours & thirty minutes after the start of the match for 8-Ball) was not utilized.

The competition for both Saturday 8-Ball, and Sunday 9-Ball totaled three full "Round Robin" rounds for each format. The first round began at 9:00 AM both Saturday 8-Ball and Sunday 9-Ball. Each team paring used two tables.

Saturday's final round of team competition concluded at approximately 6:00 PM, and Sunday's 9-Ball finished at approximately 5:00PM—Much easier time wise, on everybody this year, as all the team matches were played on two tables simultaneously.

In both 8 & 9-Ball there was an equal purse up for grabs of \$3,550 that was divvied up between the competing teams. Winning Saturday's 8-Ball top prize of \$1,400 with 23 accumulated points was: The Dugout's "Devil's Lettuce" with Team Captain: Adam Drew, and teammates Tim Cowlthorp, Karen Ronning, Robert Baker, Galeena Amyotte, Larry Swanson, and Vipin Sunkari. 


