APRIL 23th to May 1st Merle and Boomer attended the National APA League Operator conference at the Westgate Hotel & Casino which was followed by the open 8-ball and the open 9-Ball National Singles Championships April 28-May 1st.

Representing OPAL in the APA National 8-Ball Scotch doubles championships were the teams of: **Rodney Clay & Virginia Shoberg** who finished at 129th and **Kim Trip & Heidi Piehl** finished at 257th. Both finished up out of the money.

In 9-Ball **Destin** & **McKenzie Hornych** finished 97th, and out of the money. In the Wheelchair event **Joel Goodman** came in out of the higher money as well with a 33rd place finish.

In the National singles competition we had 14 competing represent-atives—6 in 8-Ball and 8 in 9-Ball. In 8-Ball, three out of the six individuals entered, made it into the higher prizes and they were: **Steve Kemp** in the (*SL-6 Orange Tier*) who placed 17th and Won \$600 in cash and prizes, **Tyler Hanson** who finished 9th in the SL-7 Purple Tier and won \$1,000 in cash & Prizes, and **Rick Hall** who finished 5th in the SL-5 Yellow Tier to win \$2,000 in cash & prizes. The rest of the OPAL field-**Dale Mick, Kelly Kent-Micheau** & **Tim Higginson** each got \$200 Travel Allowance, free lodging, \$100 last place money, a commemorative cue case, and an early vacation to enjoy all of the wondrous sites, lights, and sounds of Las Vegas.



20th Anniversary PARTY

The 2016 8-Ball OPAL-APA INVITATIONAL marked the 20th year that we had been offering this 8-Ball tournament gathering at the Chinook Winds Casino. So on Wednesday night at 7:00 PM for all APA members were invited to come attend a very special 20th anniversary party commemorating this event. Chinook Winds provided all the attending members, guests, and tournament staff a Buffet feast extraordinaire with all the fixings, and no one, and I mean "NO ONE" went away hungry. The food was plentiful, and very tasty.

Chinook Winds also donated \$1,500 to add to the festivities so at 7:45 PM we organized several FREE ENTRY fun activities and games for everyone to participate in and enjoy that paid out cash prizes. We, ran 3-Ball, A couple of Tables of 6 person Survivor games that paid out \$30 for 1st, \$20 for 2nd, and \$10 for 3rd. Also, a couple of tables of 5 person Break Contests payout out \$20 for 1st and \$10 for 2nd. All the games were administered and supervised by Merle, John, Boomer, and the referee staff: Maxine Buhler, Dan Fendall, Don Walker, Kevin McCarty, Sammy McCabe, Charlie Walker, Jeff Hiatt, and whoever else we could get to help out. But surprisingly what turned out to be the MOST POPULAR GAME OF 'EM ALL was what Merle called "THE MONEY TABLE." \$1's, 5's, 10's, and \$20 dollar bills totaling hundreds & hundreds of dollars were spread out over the playing surface of a pool table practically covering the entire thing. It was fast, quick, and a total "NO BRAINER" to play.

Men had to shoot a cue ball at least 4 multiple rails (Women had to shoot at least 3 rails) and if the cue ball came to rest, or shooter got to pick up and keep the bill. If the shooter scratched once—then they got another shot, if they scratched twice—they were done and/or go to the back of the waiting line. The line was long, but needless to say it moved very quickly. There was no limit on the amount of times a person could go through the line. It was not until after 1 o'clock in the morning that the last bill was won and picked up from off the table. Amazingly enough the last 6 bills left on the table were EVERY one —-a \$20 dollar bill.

ne week before the APA Singles & Jack 'n Jill Scotch Doubles National Championships in Las Vegas, Chinook Winds in Lincoln City hosted the OPAL-APA NW Invitational April 14-17. Again, Steve Lingelbach, and crew, from Biggies Billiards contracted the tables and set up the tournament room then administered a ton of mini tournaments for the enjoyment of players. We officially kicked off the event with 153 team pairings in the Modified Single Elimination Early Bird Scotch doubles tournament on Thursday..

Scotch play began at 9:00 AM on Thursday and progressed smoothly throughout the day to conclude in early evening with Seattle's "Shootin' For Money" *Lori Murray* & *Scott Stai* taking the top honors over the Tacoma team of "4-Earl" with *Staci Moses* and *Josh Moraga*.

The total payouts paid down to the top 64 finishers in the field minus green fees amounted to **\$10,610**. The top 32 finishers are listed in the table at right:

Chinook Winds (Continued) On Thursday Evening we scheduled our newest fun event called the TOURNAMENT OF THE POOL GODS. Basically it was a \$3. blind draw partner scotch doubles event with sudden twists of fate. Boomer and the office staff had been working on this project since last Chinook Winds trying to come up with something new and exciting that would be fun and enjoyable for everyone. They did it and this time all the "KINKS" were worked out and it went over extremely well..

Selected to play the role of the *Master of The Universe*" again was **James Moore**. Another key ingredient to the game was a 12 sided "**DIE**", but we'll get to that later. There were 96 people who signed up to play which meant that after the blind draw for a partner we ended up with 48 scotch doubles pairings which were broken down into 3 flights of 12 pairs each. **John Blue** emceed a color of money break and we were off and running. Now here's where the fun antagonizing part came into play—for lack of a better name we'll call it

"Poolicus Interruptus." because the "Cus" part reverberated throughout the room.

Whenever "The Master of the Universe" Yelled "STOP" the players had to stop immediately even if they were down in the act of shooting. Then immediately came the roll of the 12 sided Die. Whatever number that came up from "1" to "12" there was a corresponding numbered list from 1 to 12 that described a command that the players had to follow. Some of the commands were: Shoot Left Handed, Bank your next shot, Relinquish your turn and give ball in hand to your opponent, Have your partner shoot, Pool Gods place the cue ball anywhere on the table before the shooter's next shot, Pool God's mark any pocket that you want the 8-Ball to go into, The point is that there were 12 different commands that that could come up if the corresponding
