Triple Play Masters Regional

The Master's regional contest was held at Rodder's in Oregon City on May 13th at the same time that the women's team 8-ball regional was going on. The site worked out perfectly with the Master's using the eight diamond tables out in the middle room while the Jack 'n Jill used the 7 Valley tables in the back room. The competition was both fierce and interesting, and there were a few "upsets" throughout the day.

We expedited the Triple Play Master's thirteen team, five round Modified Single Elimination format by playing on two tables simultaneously, and the finals on three match tables for each team match. That worked out very amicable as we were able to finish the last final complete with picture taking and Las Vegas orientation by 8:00 PM—ish....

The Master's division qualified teams were playing for two guaranteed Las Vegas National Championship slots, but OPAL has applied for a 3rd slot that APA Hq's has not awarded us yet to date. We may or may not get that third slot—Therefore we played down where we had two distinct winners, and then had the two tied 3rd place teams play off an additional match amongst themselves to determine who would get that third slot if we get a third slot… The bottom line is that there is \$6,330 dollars that was generated from the masters divisions over the past three sessions. Each slot will be allocated \$1,890 —(enough money to pay for round-tripairfare and lodging at the Westgate Resort in Las Vegas) The remainder of the money will be played out to the entire regional team field. Right now we don't know if that figure is going to be \$660, if we have three slots, or 2,550. if we only have two slots that go. If indeed, only two teams get to go then every team in the field not going to Las Vegas will receive retroactive compensation from \$75 for last place to \$390 for 3 / 4th.

The Master's competition format was patterned after the US Amateur. The winner of the lag either choses to break or to name the game—8-Ball or 9-Ball. The opponent gets what the lag winner did not want. The race was to 7 individual game wins. If 9-Ball were chosen they played 8 games and if neither one of the players had won 7 games then they would switch to 5 games of 8 ball until one or the other of them did reach 7 games. Therefore, it was possible just to play 9-Ball and win. However, if 8-Ball were chosen there were only 5 games to be played—after which they started playing 9-Ball. Whoever won the match race won registered (1) point for the team. Once a team score totaled 2 Match-Race wins the team match was over. If they went into the Ozone layer and played more games in a category than was allowed they had to throw those games away, switch, and play the correct category. In the first round play it was Undergroud's "Heavy Strokers," 2-Zip over Orchard Tap's "SSA", Silver Star's "XXX" 2-Zip over Bull Mountain's "Outlaws," Cascade Bar's "Big Uglies" 2-Zip over Dugout's "Humble Pie;" Underground's "Benchwarmers" 2-1 over 4th Plain Tavern's "Dawg Pound;" and 3 Monkey's "Beef Supreme" 2-1 over "Dugout's" "Chalk Is Cheap." Home Turf's "Dragons," and 3 Monkey's "Coolers," all had "Byes."

in the 2nd round winner's side the "<u>Coolers</u>" iced the "<u>Heavy Strokers</u>" 2-1. "Big Uglies" took down "XXX" 2-1, "Home Turf Dragon's" breathed fire over "Bench Warmers" 2 –1, and. "<u>Beef Supreme</u>" 2-Zipped "<u>Last Minute</u>" 2-1. and on the backside there was only one match going. It was **Dugout's** "<u>Humble Pie</u>" humbly showing the **Bull Mountain** "<u>Outlaws</u>" the way out the door to home.

In round 3 of the loser's side the "<u>Last Minutes</u>" froze out "<u>SSA</u>" 2-Zip sending them ass backwards on out the door and down the road; "<u>Humble Pie</u>" graciously put an end to "<u>Bench Warmers</u>" journey 2-1: "<u>Dawg Pound</u>" out-played "<u>XXX</u>" sending them home; and "<u>Chalk Is Cheap</u>" outlasted "<u>Heavy Strokers</u>" 2-1 sending them out the door to home as well. It was they who had secured the first bragging rights to the plane seats to the Las Vegas Nationals next August.

Playing for the Second guaranteed Las Vegas slot was the undefeated 3 Monkey's team of the "Coolers" from the Triple Play Master's Vancouver division. Their opponent was Home Turf's "Last Minute" from the Triple Play Master's West Division who had gotten knocked into the loser's side in the 2nd round by "<u>Beef Supreme</u>" "<u>Last Minute</u>" came out of the gate giving it all they had. Even though "<u>Coolers</u>" **Bob Olson** was up 6 to 1 on his race to 7 over "<u>Last Minute's</u>" **Phil** Bremer it was all a moot point because "Last Minute's" Andrew Dalby took down "Coolers" Larry Schave 7-5 for the 1st point, and Jason Bennett slipped by "Coolers" Greg Sowder to secure the winning 2nd point. Therefore, Home Turf's "Last Minute" from the Triple play Master's West divison with Team Captain: Jason Bennett, and teammates-Phil Bremer, Isaac Norman and Andrew Dalby had secured the second set of bragging rights to the plane seats heading into the Las Vegas Nationals come next August.

Playing off for the "Maybe Baby" third possible third slot to Las Vegas was two teams that had both been undefeated going into the finals, but who no longer had that distinction coming out of the finals...! They were, of course, "Beef Supreme" and the "Coolers" --- Who both play

out of the "3 monkeys" in the Vancouver Masters Division, There would be no Guaranteed slot to Las Vegas, only a hope that one would materialize. Like the other finals they played on 3 tables simultaneously. On the third table "Cooler's" Bob Olson 97217705 came out of the gate smoking against "Beef Supreme's" Mike Dowell. Bob took the first 5 games, of 8-Ball. Then switching to 9-Ball Bob won the first game, lost the 2nd game, and then closed the deal with a


win in the third game to take the match 7-1.

- X NEVER GIVE UP UNTIL THE LAST BALL FALLS.

REMEMBER: relax, enjoy yourself and play within the spirit of the rules rather then the written rule. It is impossible to cover every situation 100% with rules Common sense, and good sportsmanship MUST PRE-VAIL. "Win at the table and not from the chair" is a generality that promotes harmony, camaraderie, and good times. And that folk's, to be sure, is exactly what WE of OPAL-APA strive continuously to be all about.
